



Patient Instructions Urine Collection for Infants & Small Children

This procedure is to be used for collecting a urine specimen for Urinalysis or Urine Culture for infants and small children who are unable to collect a clean catch voided specimen.

- 1. Obtain a pediatric urine collection bag with hypoallergenic skin adhesive and antiseptic wipes from the laboratory department.
- Separate the child's legs.
- 3. Clean the pubic and perineal areas with the antiseptic wipes provided by the laboratory.
- 4. Remove the protective paper, exposing the hypoallergenic skin adhesive
- 5. Girls:
 - a. Stretch the perineum to separate skin folds.
 - b. Press the adhesive firmly to the skin all around the vagina.
 - c. Be sure to start at the bridge of the skin separating and rectum form the vagina and work forward sealing the adhesive to the skin.
- 6. Boys:
 - a. Fit the bag over the penis and press the adhesive firmly to the perineum.
 - b. Make sure the entire adhesive coating is firmly attached to the skin with no puckering of the adhesive.
- 7. Check the urine bag every 15 minutes until the child has voided.
- 8. Pour the urine in the sterile urine cup that was provided by the laboratory.
- 9. Write the child's Name/Date of Birth/Requesting Physician on the label.
- 10. Deliver it to the laboratory Patient Care Service area as soon as possible.
- 11. If unable to deliver immediately, keep refrigerated. Urine should be delivered to the laboratory no later than 8 hours after collection.
