Holy Cross Health is a Catholic, not-for-profit health system that serves the two most populous counties in Maryland, Montgomery and Prince George's, with a commitment to being the most trusted provider of health care services in the area. Founded in 1963 by the Sisters of the Holy Cross, Holy Cross Health is a member of Trinity Health of Livonia, Michigan. Holy Cross Hospital, in Silver Spring, is one of the largest hospitals in Maryland, and Holy Cross Germantown Hospital is the first hospital in the nation on a community college campus, enhanced by an educational partnership. The Holy Cross Health Network operates primary care practices and affordable health centers, and offers a wide range of innovative, community-based health and wellness programs. Specialty care, home care and hospice services round out Holy Cross Health's high-quality and coordinated continuum of care that aims to improve health and move life ahead for individuals and populations in the communities we serve. In fiscal 2021, Holy Cross Health contributed nearly 9% of its \$655 million in revenue to community benefit activities that meet community needs and improve access to health



WE LISTENED & GAVE ROSE MOBILITY

Easing the Way to a Better Life

n 2016, Rose Nakagwa was tired and in pain. Both of her hips were so painful she had to rely on a walker to get around, and she was unable to work. A friend suggested she go to the Holy Cross Health Center in Silver Spring for help. But Rose, now 74, without health insurance, had been denied care so often, she resisted. Her friend wouldn't give up. Rose remembers her friend saying, "'Please, try these people. They are good.'"

Rose finally acted on her friend's encouragement, and discovered a community of health professionals unlike any she had met before. "Everyone treated me well, from the first person I met in reception to the nurses and doctors, everyone knows me. It's really amazing," Rose says.

Rose's health center physician, nurses, and social worker partnered to get Rose the care and services she needed. They arranged a Metro Pass so she could access health services more easily. They helped her obtain health insurance so she could have X-rays, surgery, and physical therapy at Holy Cross Hospital in Silver Spring. After her surgery, their support continued. The center's caregivers visited her at home, even providing medical equipment that would aid in Rose's recovery.

Today, Rose is strong enough not only to walk but to work. Free of a cane or walker, she assists a client who is himself confined to a wheelchair, helping him get around.

Rose continues to visit the Holy Cross Health Center in Silver Spring for ongoing check-ups and care. "I love the way they treat people and the care they give me. It has changed my life forever. I am so grateful."

Rose keeps current with her health through preventive care at the Holy Cross Health Center in Silver Spring. Part of the Holy Cross Health Network, four Holy Cross Health Centers serve individuals who are uninsured and underinsured. The health centers provide primary care, integrated behavioral health, social work services, health education and access to medications and specialty care. This coordinated team of caregivers helps patients manage chronic conditions to reduce unnecessary hospitalizations and improve their overall wellbeing.

Vaccination Champions Everywhere

Holy Cross Health's Community Health services kept pace with the pandemic's changing course, beginning with a COVID-19 information line, which provided callers with essential health updates about quarantines, testing and other issues. As time went on, the scope of information expanded to include test results and assistance with making secure, convenient vaccination appointments by phone for those lacking the access or skill to schedule an appointment online.



Leonard and Elfreda Massie received their first dose at a COVID-19 vaccine clinic hosted by the Kingdom Fellowship AME Church and Holy Cross Health in February.

Recognizing the hardest-hit populations were not those seeking vaccination, we teamed with partners at the state, county and neighborhood levels, setting up clinics in churches, apartment complexes, local restaurants and, yes, barbershops. Clinic hours served those working multiple shifts, and staff included Spanish speakers. At every opportunity, including the 15-minute wait after a vaccination, we conducted social needs screening — listening and learning about people's food insecurity, housing needs, unemployment issues, and other challenges. Then we worked with our partners to address them.

By end of year, we had conducted more than 145 clinics, administered more than 7,000 COVID-19 vaccines, and identified countless individuals who needed lifechanging social services — and received them.

ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY PARTNERS WITH PERSONALIZED CARE

Easing Cancer Care & Recovery

n the midst of performing Sheila Hughes's March 2017 hysterectomy, Albert J. Steren, MD, Holy Cross Health's medical director of Gynecologic Oncology, discovered that Sheila's previously diagnosed endometrial cancer was far more extensive than initially thought. The disease had unexpectedly spread to nearby lymph nodes, advancing to stage 3C1 endometrioid adenocarcinoma. Yet, because Dr. Steren was performing Sheila's surgery with the highly advanced, minimally invasive *da Vinci*® Xi robotic system, he was able to precisely target and remove the cancerous tissue — and with so few and such small incisions, Sheila was able to go home the very same day.

"It's incredible when you think about it," Dr. Steren says, four years later. "Sheila had advanced uterine cancer, was treated laparoscopically, and went home."

"It was in and out," confirms Sheila, a software test engineer. "I could have gone back to work the next day." Chemotherapy and radiation treatment followed.

Due to her successful treatment, Sheila remains disease-free four years later. In the interim, Holy Cross Hospital's and Holy Cross Germantown Hospital's high-tech robotic surgery capabilities have become even more advanced, while the personalized, one-on-one "customer skills" — that Sheila greatly appreciated — remain a constant. "Every individual caregiver," she remembers, "introduced themselves and told me what I could expect. That was very, very key for me. It helped me relax and set my mind at ease, and made this such a smooth process."

As Holy Cross Health brings the full range of cancer care services to the innovative Holy Cross Health Cancer Institute in Wheaton, Maryland, cancer patients' experience will be eased even further. At what can be the most vulnerable time of their lives, Dr. Steren says, "everything will be integrated so patients get everything they need." The Holy Cross Radiation Treatment Center will be relocated to the new facility in August 2022 with updated equipment, and comprehensive ambulatory treatment and support services will be in place by late 2022/early 2023. Raising the Bar for Clinical Excellence

Leadership in the COVID-19 Era

Holy Cross Health was exceptionally well prepared and able to respond to the health emergency that COVID-19 quickly became — in part because Holy Cross Hospital has long been designated one of the area's five Special Pathogen Assessment Hospitals. Immediately, Holy Cross Health secured a sustainable supply of protective equipment for our colleagues. Space in our hospitals was reallocated to care for the isolated COVID-19 patients. And after years of planning and drills with multiple regional partners, we were ready to spring into action. Now, more than 96 weeks out from the pandemic's start, the impact of our preparation and constant readiness has made Holy Cross Health one of the top health systems caring for COVID-19 patients.

Investing in New Technology

Both Holy Cross Hospital and Holy Cross Germantown Hospital acquired the Zimmer Biomet ROSA® Knee System for minimally invasive, robot-assisted total knee replacements. The new system creates 3D replications of the patient's knee and generates real-time information, used by surgeons to create a plan unique to each patient. Enhancing Care Coordination for Seniors

Holy Cross Health's Care Transformation Organization (CTO) helps our Holy Cross Health Partners primary care physicians better coordinate the care of Medicare patients, in accordance with the Maryland Primary Care Program. By improving communications with partners, coordinating appropriate patient care settings, and promoting self-care, our CTO already has proven its worth. Our patients have improved their control of chronic conditions like diabetes and high blood pressure, and reduced emergency room utilization.

Clinical Trials and Research

Patients and referring physicians trust Holy Cross Health for advanced cancer care, including access to groundbreaking clinical trials. Led by principal investigator, James Barter, MD, medical director of gynecologic oncology research, Holy Cross Health continued to participate in national clinical trials for ovarian and cervical cancer, bringing our



patients access to new drugs prior to FDA approval. Our contributions to research trials led to FDA approval for avastin and niraparib for the treatment of ovarian cancer and cemiplimab-rwlc for the treatment of cervical cancer. Virtual Geriatric House Calls

When the COVID-19 pandemic made it difficult to visit home-bound patients in congregate settings, Holy Cross responded. We transitioned to video telemedicine visits for our Geriatric House Calls program to ensure vulnerable seniors continued to receive necessary medical care without the risks of in-person visits.

Caring for Our Workforce

lavie S. Johnston, MSN, BSN, RN-BC, clinical nurse supervisor at the Holy Cross Health Center in Aspen Hill, came to Holy Cross in 2007 with an associate degree in nursing, earned her bachelor's degree, and then — with tuition assistance from Holy Cross — her master's degree. Wendy Mejia, RN, a bedside nurse in Holy Cross Hospital's Surgical Intensive Care Unit (SICU) since 2007, was first employed by Holy Cross as a certified nursing assistant (as part of Montgomery County's Latino Health Initiative) while she trained to become a registered nurse. Tess Wiley, BSN, RN, has been a Holy Cross Germantown Hospital Emergency Department nurse from the day the hospital opened seven years ago.

Although each of these three nurses has her own story, all agree: Holy Cross Health listens to them, supports them, and values them. They find meaning in being able to help others and enjoy working among a "family" of colleagues. Year by year, Holy Cross Health has defined their careers and their daily experiences regularly confirm, "this is why I'm here."

Flavie Johnston is "just amazed with the incredible work Holy Cross conducts in the community and our mission to provide low-cost health care services to the uninsured and underinsured. When I see patients very grateful for all our hard work, I feel like I'm doing something helpful, something meaningful. This is why I love Holy Cross. It's a place I feel I belong."

For **Wendy Mejia**, who first came to Holy Cross Health in 2006, and whose SICU became a dedicated-COVID-19 unit during the worst of the pandemic, "I have learned that being a bedside nurse is a noble career, a career you do with your heart. Here, I feel like we are in a family — our traditions and languages are respected — and we have what we need and all the support we need to do the best for our patients."

Tess Wiley says, "I've been a nurse for 17 years, and at three other facilities before Holy Cross. Nowhere have I ever felt as supported as I do here. During COVID-19, leadership listened to how our lives were being turned upside down and helped me balance my career with my home life by providing support for my daughter's child care while schools were closed. We're taken care of, and we really support one another."

Belgica Alvarez knows that doing her job and doing it well is an important part of patient care. Belgica is a floor technician, cleaning floors throughout the hospital from 3 to 11:30 p.m., Environmental Services' second shift. "I'm very honored to keep the hospital clean for patients."



The thoroughness of Belgica's

work has won notice, called "wonderful" and "the best!" When she works on a floor, she says, she moves items out of the way, an unexpected touch appreciated by hospital caregivers who tell her that the floors she cleans "look brand new!"

Belgica is so comfortable working with the hospital and pleased with the benefits offered she encouraged a friend to apply. Today, Belgica and her friend work the same shift, cleaning those areas of the hospital assigned to them that day, whether in the Emergency Department, Maternity Center or lobby. Now more than two and a half years since starting at Holy Cross Hospital, Belgica remains extremely happy, respected for her role in maintaining a safe, clean, healthy environment.



Our NICU Team Gives Back

Ryan Donald Basile Memorial Fund

oly Cross Hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) is special. In caring for critically ill newborns and their families, the NICU's highly trained neonatologists, nurses and dedicated staff have formed a special bond, many of whom have worked together for decades. So when the NICU's long-time nurse practitioner, Susan Basile, NNP-BC, experienced a profound tragedy, the 2020 death of her 25-year-old son Ryan, the outpouring of sympathy from her NICU colleagues and their desire to create a lasting memorial was immediate.

Sue's long-time friend and colleague, NICU nurse Nina Scott, RNC, galvanized her fellow colleagues to honor Ryan's memory with a bench dedication positioned just outside the Holy Cross Hospital chapel where all could rest and reflect. Janel Hino, MD, chief of neonatology at Holy Cross Health, had an additional idea. "What better way to support families than to honor someone who has been a member of our Holy Cross family for over 30 years, and create a fund that goes 100% to help NICU families in need."

The idea of the Ryan Donald Basile Memorial Fund for NICU Families in Need was born. Donations of all sizes quickly began pouring in, beginning with an inaugural donation from Dr. Hino's own practice. Donations were received nationwide from Ryan's family and friends, grateful parents and grandparents of past NICU newborns, our NICU caregivers, and even from two local children who donated proceeds from a garage sale.

The fund began helping NICU families almost immediately. Contributions, guided by Holy Cross Health social workers, have funded Uber gift cards for carless families, making it possible for them to visit their infants easily and more frequently; monitors and other medical equipment not covered by insurance; and assistance with funeral costs for infants who did not survive.

More than \$100,000 has been raised from 84 donors since the fund was officially announced at Ryan's memorial bench dedication in March 2021. "The money has come from all over, and it's all been helpful," says Sue. "I'm honored by it. It has been healing."
